FROM THE MAYOR'S CORNER

Dear Surfsiders,

Summer in South Florida is here, and once again we face the potential for strong weather disturbances and the possibility of hurricanes. All the forecasters are predicting a very active season. The time to prepare is *now*, as plywood, flashlights, batteries, gasoline and water become scarce during a declared emergency. If you are elderly and infirm, **and have special needs** (e.g. the use of oxygen), please register *now* with the Surfside Police Department. If they are aware of your needs in advance of a storm, they will be better able to coordinate your evacuation with Miami-Dade County Emergency Operations personnel and the Special Needs Shelters. If your neighbor is elderly or infirm, verify that they have registered with the Surfside Police Department. Keep in mind that area shelters do not allow animals. Therefore, it is prudent to have an emergency plan for your pets prior to a

storm situation. If you need further assistance in developing a hurricane evacuation plan, please feel free to contact me through e-mail (mayor@townofsurfsidefl.gov) or at Town Hall 305-861-4863. The Town website www.townofsurfsidefl.gov also provides a link to the County's Emergency Management website.

This issue of the Gazette ushers in the beginning of the 2005 - 2006 school year. Please be especially cautious when driving around our neighborhoods. Look out for our new, little pedestrians - they will not necessarily be looking for you! The Surfside Police Department is as committed as ever to ensuring our children's safety. Officers will continue to shadow the school buses and maintain vigilant patrol of our area streets, particularly during the hours when children are walking or riding, to and from, school.

SURFSIDE COMMISSION HIGHLIGHTS



1. TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT:

The Town Manager reported that the Commission heard presentations from each of the four lobbyist firms short-listed. The firms were: Robert M. Levy & Associates, Akerman-Senterfitt, Gomez-Barker Associates, Inc., and Tew Cardenas, LLP. Commissioner Jimenez moved to select the lobbyist firm of Gomez-Barker Associates, Inc. and directed the Town Manager to negotiate a contract with the firm. Commissioner Levine seconded. The motion carried unanimously 4-0.

Regarding the Comprehensive Annual Finance Report (CAFR) and Audited Financial Records for fiscal year ended September 30, 2004, the Town Manager asked that the Town Commission accept the report which had been previously disseminated. The Town Manager thanked the Town Auditor Alyce Jones, of A.M. Jones, C.P.A., P.A. and Accounting Manager Bella Carcasses for their hard work in preparing the Comprehensive Annual Finance Report. Commissioner Levine made a motion to accept the Comprehensive Annual Finance Report for the fiscal year ended September 30, 2004. Commissioner Coto seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously 4-0.

The Town Manager also announced that additional copies of the Comprehensive Annual Finance Report would be available from the Town Clerk or could be downloaded from the Town's website.

The Town Manager announced that a Budget Workshop will be held on Tuesday August 9, 2005, at 6:00 p.m., prior to the August regular Commission Meeting.

The Town Manager stated that the First Public Budget Hearing will be held on Tuesday, September 13, 2005 at 6:00 p.m. and, the Final Public Budget Hearing has been scheduled for Wednesday, September 28, 2005 at 6:00 p.m.

The Town Manager requested authorization to put out an RFP for a

landscape architect. Commissioner Levine moved to authorize the Town Manager to put out the RFP. Commissioner Jimenez seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously 4-0.

The Town Manager announced that as of November, the Metro-Dade Route "R" bus will be re-aligned from Dickens Avenue to Harding Avenue. The Town Manager also reported that different routes are being looked at for the Surfside Circulator. Additionally, the Town Manager recommended privatizing the Circulator service and said that he would bring a proposal to the Town Commission during the Budget Workshop, for discussion.

Regarding the Surf-Bal-Bay Police Athletic/Activities League (PAL) the Town Manager announced that due to the threat of Hurricane Dennis, the 1st Annual Surf-Bal-Bay Police Athletic/Activities League Pancake Breakfast originally scheduled for Saturday, July 9th, was now rescheduled for Saturday, July 30th.

The Town Manager requested the Town Commission approve a Special Commission Meeting to be held on Tuesday, August 16, 2005 at 7:00 p.m. to discuss the Community Center Project. He noted that various proposals will be presented at the meeting. Commissioner Levine moved to call a Special Commission Meeting for Tuesday, August 16, 2005 at 7:00 p.m. Commissioner Jimenez seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously 4-0.

ORDINANCE FOR SECOND READING/PUBLIC HEARING:

2. An Ordinance of the Town of Surfside, Florida repealing and replacing Chapter 22 of the Code of the Town of Surfside as it pertains to cable television franchises; providing penalty for violation of the provisions hereof; providing inclusion in the Code; repealing all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith; and providing an

effective date. VOTE: UNANIMOUS 4-0

3. An Ordinance of the Town of Surfside, Florida awarding a non exclusive cable television franchise to Atlantic Broadband (Miami) LLC for a period of ten (10) years; repealing all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith; and providing an effective date. VOTE: UNANIMOUS 4-0

RESOLUTION APPROVING NPDES PERMIT No. FLS000003

4. A Resolution of the Town Commission of the Town of Surfside, Florida, approving an interlocal agreement between the Town, all other Co-permittees named in the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit Number FLS000003, and Miami-Dade County for the performance of professional services and between all Co-permittees providing for control of pollutant discharges between shared municipal separate storm sewers; authorizing the Mayor to sign the agreement on behalf of the Town; and providing an effective date. VOTE: UNANIMOUS 4-0

RESOLUTION APPROVING EXPENDITURE FOR ANNUAL DRUG AWARENESS DAY

5. A Resolution of the Town Commission of the Town of Surfside, Florida providing for the fiscal year 2004/2005 Police Confiscation Fund expenditure in the amount of \$13,000 to be funded by proceeds of confiscated funds. VOTE: UNANIMOUS 4-0

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A MUTUAL AIDE AGREEMENT WITH THE CITY OF SUNNY ISLES BEACH.

6. A Resolution of the Town of Surfside authorizing and directing the Town Manager and the Town Clerk to execute a Mutual Aid Agreement and the Chief of Police and the Town Clerk to execute a joint declaration with the City of Sunny Isles Beach. VOTE: UNANIMOUS 4-0



CODE COMPLIANCE PROCEDURES



Property Owners Can Improve Their Home, Business And The Neighborhood

By Paying Attention To Exterior Maintenance

- Make sure that exterior building surfaces and roofs are not cracked, chipped, pitted, discolored, peeling or fading.
- Window and door frames should be free of rust, chips, cracks, or holes and be weather and watertight. Glass areas should be without cracks or holes as well.
- Any exterior signs should be in good repair. If it is a lighted sign, all the lights should be working.
- Outdoor ground areas should be planted with sufficient ground cover to prevent the blowing or eroding of soil.
- Paved areas should be free of potholes, excessive cracking and/or plant growth and be free of concrete spalling.
- Awnings should be clean and free of tears, holes, dirt, discoloration or fading. All awning hardware, supports and poles should be straight, rust-free and in good condition.
- No air conditioner, heating or cooling device greater than 24,000 Btu capacity should be installed so as to be visible from the street.

FREE HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS MANUALS NOW AVAILABLE



All Surfside boat owners are encouraged to stop by the Lobby Counter of Town Hall and pick up a *free* copy of the Hurricane Preparedness Manual for Marine Interests, prepared by the Florida Inland Navigation District. The manual describes how to prepare your vessel or marine facility prior to hurricane season and for an approaching storm. Information provided will include: general precautions for boat owners; specific precautions for marina owners before, during and after a storm; methods of tying vessels to cleats and pilings; procedures to make a damage claim; and, a boat owner's preparation worksheet.
