# Message from the Town Manager

First and foremost congratulations to our new Commissioner Michelle Kligman. In our first electronic age campaign, she ran an old fashioned race. Hard work, knocking on doors, putting together a group of supporters, learning about the issues, attending meetings and getting out the vote. The elation when the vote was announced in the Commission Chambers was inspiring. She will be a wonderful addition to the already wonderful Town Commission. And to our friends at the Miami Herald, congratulations on trying to cover this study in contrasts race fairly, however, please stop calling Michelle a "stay at home mom." While there is everything good with that status in life, Commissioner Kligman earned a Ph.D., had a career in public service and made an informed decision to take some time off to raise her two children and assist her husband's business. She also chose to step to the plate to run for office when no one else did the first time around costing our taxpayers nearly \$25,000 for the special election. On behalf of the Town Commission, the Town employees and the community...welcome aboard.

The Town Commission held a prioritization session and a discussion of the process to achieve Charter reform last week. There are some wonderful debates coming which will be handled in the new Surfside style. Very detailed staff and legal work supported by independent expertise when necessary, open discussion with stakeholders usually televised for those who cannot attend the advertised meetings, full disclosure of the alternatives including costs and mitigations and a final decision made by the Town Commission in a public open format where participation is welcomed. Some of the issues coming over the next year include the debate over how to solve the parking shortage downtown, a discussion about placing all the utilities underground town wide and how to pay for the project, a discussion of the need for and method to achieve a second floor on our highly successful Community Center, the type of building that will replace the Best Western hotel and major potential projects at the Surf Club and the Shul on Collins Avenue. I promise that we will deal with all these issues with openness and fairness. Please remember that debate in our pluralistic and complex community is not a bad thing. Rancor and personal attacks should not be tolerated as this behavior is not part of the new Surfside which embraces the old traditions while incorporating the best of the new realities of life.

Regarding the water/sewer/storm drainage project, we are now half way to completion. The project is slightly ahead of schedule and on target with the budget. Thanks for your patience during the inconvenience of construction. Also, a note of caution. If someone knocks on your door make sure they have identification. Bona fide workers do need to go onto your yard to hook up the new system. If you have any concerns, call Bill Evans, Public Works Director at 786 350-8190. If you feel threatened in any way call 911.

for disseminating untruths and for a vicious undeserved attack on Town Attorney Lynn Dannheiser. Former Mayor Marion Portman, our first female Mayor and the first female Mayor in Miami Dade County, called me to remind me that the Town Manager should stay above the fray and always remain professional. I have taken her advice in all messages since. However, we all need to think about why no one stepped forward for the first election and how to engage more people at all stages of life in the governance of this wonderful community. Watch for a recommendation to establish Surfside University in conjunction with FIU coming soon. The program would include approximately ten evening sessions over a year in which citizens would attend in depth discussions about Town operations and politics. The goal is to light that spark that would make someone want to serve on a committee or board and eventually run for office. We are going through a demographic change in Surfside and this might help to facilitate the transition to dynamic new leadership.

On a personal basis, I became eligible for Medicare this month. Who would have thought that this long haired free spirit from the 1960s would morph to a Medicareeligible career bureaucrat. My wife Beth will wrap up her 35 year career with Miami Dade County in September. # Fina Escayola Spreads Culture through Flamenco

Fina Escayola, a native of Barcelona, Spain, has been a Surfside resident for over 30 years. She is a renowned Flamenco dancer and teacher who has promoted the culture of Spain and Spanish dance to students of all ages. She has taught at Miami-Dade Community College, the



YMCA and South Florida schools, making dance classes accessible to everyone. In the 1970s she was the first person to introduce the popular "Sevillanas" dance – now known throughout the country. Many of her students have gone on to open schools of their own and perform internationally. Her company, the Ballet Español de Fina Escayola, was named the official dance company representing Spain by the Spanish Consulate and performed throughout Florida and the United States, appearing on television, film, theater, opera and at events such as the Miami Film Festival, Miami Book Fair, Surfside Art Festival, Hispanic Heritage Festival, Calle Ocho and the Miss Universe Pageant.

Prof. Escayola is also the founder of the Centro Artistico Cultural Español, which sponsors events showcasing the cultural arts of Spain. Her show, "Fina y España" was broadcast on public television and featured regions of Spain. She has been awarded the keys to the City of Miami Beach, Miami and Miami-Dade County. She is listed in the Who's Who of U.S. Commerce and the Hispanic VIP Directory. She was elected an Ambassador to assist with the Papal visit to Miami and King Juan Carlos of Spain awarded her the prestigious Lazo del Merito Civil for promoting Spanish culture. She is currently teaching at Fairlawn Elementary School and Shenandoah Middle School (a Museums Magnet Program School and only local public school offering Flamenco in their curriculum). Prof. Escayola found time to take the Surfside Citizens Police Academy and graduate - a program she truly enjoyed and highly recommends! She lives in Surfside with her sister Lola, niece Susana (both previous flamenco dancers) and their dogs, including lure course champion, Bella Maria Basenji, who was rescued on Byron Ave. Prof. Escayola welcomes inquiries about classes and special events. # Native Surfsider and Pharmacist Scott Portman

The son of a prominent Surfside family, Scott Portman was born and raised in Surfside and has now returned to the town he loves. After a successful career of building and selling his own pharmacies, he now works as a pharmacist at area Publix supermarkets.

Truly a hometown boy, Scott and his three sisters all attended Ruth K. Broad Bay Harbor K-8 Center (then



Elementary), Nautilus Middle School and Miami Beach High School. He even had a Surfside paper route for the *Miami Beach Sun* and the former *Miami News*. Scott received his undergraduate degree from University of Miami and earned his pharmacy degree from Northeast Louisiana University.

He owned and operated a pharmacy in

Bay Harbor Islands in the early 1990s. After selling the business, he opened another pharmacy in Boca Raton, which was very successful. Eventually he sold it to Eckerds - now CVS. After living in semi-retirement for several years on a ranch near Aspen, Colorado, Scott is back in Surfside.

Scott's mother, Marion was elected as Surfside's first woman Mayor in 1974 and was the first elected female Mayor in all of Miami Dade's municipalities. A retired public school teacher who works in real estate, Marion resides in Surfside. Scott's father, Stanley Portman was a general contractor who built dozens of homes in Surfside in the 1960s and 1970s.

"This is really a great town with a nice atmosphere," he said. "It is full of memories for me and I really enjoy being back in Surfside again."

## Speaking of Turtles, Nesting Season is Here



Turtle nesting season in Florida beachside communities is from March-October. If you see an adult sea turtle or hatchling on the beach:

- **DO NOT** report normal crawling or nesting (digging or laying eggs) unless the turtle is in a dangerous situation or has wandered off the beach. (Last year, a baby hatchling crawled off the beach, into the Community Center and headed for the pool).
- Stay away from the turtles. Nesting is a critical stage in the sea turtle's life cycle. Please leave them undisturbed.
- DO REPORT all stranded (dead or injured) turtles to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission.
- NEVER handle hatching sea turtles. If you observe hatchings wandering away from the ocean or on the beach, call 1-888-404 or \*FWC (mobile phone).


