ORDINANCE NO. 2024-1779

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN COMMISSION OF THE TOWN OF SURFSIDE, FLORIDA AMENDING ARTICLE VII. - "CODE OF ETHICS" BY AMENDING SECTIONS 2-230 EXPLOITATION OF OFFICIAL POSITION PROHIBITED; AMENDING SECTION 2-233 CONFLICT OF INTEREST; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the Town of Surfside ("Town") Commission adopted a Code of Ethics on April 10, 2007 establishing standards of conduct for current and former town officials, employees and persons doing business with the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Town Commission subsequently amended the Code of Ethics on January 15, 2013 pursuant to Ordinance 2013-1599; December 9, 2014 pursuant to Ordinance 2014-1628; February 16, 2017 pursuant to Ordinance 2017-1667; March 13, 2018 pursuant to Ordinance 2018-1679; December 11, 2018 pursuant to Ordinance 2018-1692; and October 10, 2019 pursuant to Ordinance 2019-1703, to impose additional regulations for Town elected officials; and

WHEREAS, the Town Commission finds that high ethical standards governing the conduct of public officers and employees are important and serve the public interest, and desires to further amend the Code of Ethics in Article VII of the Town Code to preclude elected officials of the Town from receiving any direct or indirect financial income or benefit by voting on any item coming before the Town Commission while in office and for a period of time thereafter; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COMMISSION OF THE TOWN OF SURFSIDE, FLORIDA:

<u>Section 1. Recitals</u>. The above Recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this reference.

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22 Section 2. Town Code Amended. Article VII. - "Code of Ethics" of the Surfside 23 Town Code of Ordinances is hereby amended and shall read as follows: 24 **ARTICLE VII. - CODE OF ETHICS** 25 26 27 28 Sec. 2-230. - Exploitation of official position prohibited. 29 30 (a) No advisory personnel, autonomous personnel, candidate, commissioner, 31 departmental personnel, employees, officers or quasi-judicial personnel shall 32 use or attempt to use an official position to secure special privileges or 33 exemptions for that person or others except as may be specifically permitted 34 by other ordinances and resolutions previously adopted or hereafter adopted 35 by the town commission. Notwithstanding any provision of this Code of Ethics, 36 no elected official who votes on an item may thereafter benefit, financially or 37 as otherwise precluded by this Code of Ethics, directly or indirectly, from work 38 or services rendered for any person, property or business located in Town 39 resulting from said vote. 40 41 (b) Continuing application for two (2) years after town service. 42 43 (1) No person who has served as an elected town official shall for a period of 44 two (2) years after his or her town service has ceased, lobby any town 45 commissioner, officer or departmental personnel or employee in connection 46 with any judicial or other proceeding, application, RFP, RFQ, bid, contract, 47 claim, controversy, charge, accusation, arrest or other particular subject 48 matter in which the town or one of its departments or instrumentalities is a 49 party or has any interest whatever, whether direct or indirect. Further, upon 50 leaving elected office and for two (2) years thereafter, no former elected 51 official may benefit, financially or as otherwise precluded by this Code of 52 Ethics, directly or indirectly, from work or services rendered for any person, 53 property or business located in Town resulting from any vote on an item made 54 as an elected official. 55 56 (2) No former advisory personnel, autonomous personnel, officer or quasi-57 judicial personnel shall for a period of two (2) years after his or her town 58 service has ceased, lobby the town board or committee on which he or she 59 served in connection with any matter related to the board or committee's 60 enforcement, oversight or authority. 61 62 63 64 Sec. 2-233. - Conflict of interest. 65

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To avoid misunderstandings and conflict of interests, which could arise, the following policy will be adhered to by employees and officers of the town. This policy is in accordance with F.S. § 112.311 et seq., code of ethics for public officers and employees.

- (1) Employees and officers shall not accept any gifts, favors, or services that may reasonably tend to improperly influence them in the discharge of their official duties:
- (2) Employees and officers shall not use or attempt to use their position to secure special privileges or exemptions for themselves or others;
- (3) Employees and officers shall not accept employment or engage in any business or professional activity, which they may reasonably expect, would require or induce them to disclose confidential information acquired by them by reason of their official position;
- (4) Employees and officers shall not disclose confidential information gained by reason of their official position, nor shall they otherwise use such information for their personal gain or benefit;
- (5) Employees and officers shall not have personal investment in any enterprise, which will create a conflict between their private interest and the public interest;
- (6) Employees and officers shall disclose to the town clerk, upon a form created by the town clerk, any direct or indirect interest in any for profit business relationship and any interest in real property which the employees and officers hold with any other employee or officer;
- (7) In addition to the foregoing, town commissioners shall disclose to the town clerk, upon a form created by the town clerk, any direct or indirect interest in non-homesteaded real property located within the town within 30 days upon purchasing said property. (Upon the passage of this article, the town commissioners shall have 30 days from the effective date, to file disclosure.) Thereafter, the town commissioners will be required to file the real property disclosure in accordance with this subparagraph (7) on a yearly basis along with his/her Form 1. However, if for any reason the town clerk does not receive same, s/he shall, in writing and via certified mail, request such official who has failed to file the required disclosure to do so. Thereafter, failure to make this filing, within ten days from receipt of the clerk's notice, shall result in the same penalties as failure to file a Form 1 disclosure as required by the county and state.
- (8) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Code of Ethics, all elected officials in office shall, on January 15 and July 15 of each year, or the first business day thereafter if a non-workday, beginning in the year 2025, declare to the Town Clerk in writing, all sources of income, passive or active, directly or indirectly, from work or services rendered for any person, property or business located in Town for the time period between the current and past report. If none, the declaration is still required and shall state None.

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121	Section 4. Inclusion in the Code. It is the intention of the Town

124	Ordinance may be renumbered or re-lettered to accomplish such intentions; and the word		
125	"Ordinance" may be changed to "Section" or other appropriate word.		
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127	Section 5. Conflict. Any and all Ordinances and Resolutions or parts or		
128	Ordinances or Resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.		
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130	Section 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upor		
131	adoption.
