

Manager's Message

There is much good news as we pass the midway point of the summer. Top of the list is the successful opening of the new and wonderful Community Center. The opening hosted more than 1000 Surfsiders, speeches were short, Belkys Nerey was great, the entertainment and food were superb and the closing fireworks were terrific. Thanks to many folks who worked hard to make this a success. Thanks to Tony Murray for sponsoring the event with a generous donation. There are two major water/sewer/storm drainage projects that will begin after years of discussion in the next few weeks. The first is the new sewer force main that will run the entire length of Surfside on Collins Avenue. This will give us a back-up force main to take our sewage to Miami Beach and eventually allow the possibility of a second disposal source at the North Dade Treatment Plant. The second is the replacement of our water and sewer systems as well as upgrades to the storm drainage system predominantly west of Harding Avenue. Both these projects will cause some traffic disruptions. We are trying to complete the Collins Avenue project before Christmas. The other project west of Harding is divided into three neighborhoods and their incentive bonuses to complete the work quickly. The total project is 18 months long in three six month segments. There will also be at townwide meeting at City Hall on August 3 at 6:30 pm. The meeting will be televised on Channel 77.

The Surfside Police Department will be providing the 2012 Resident Parking Permits at Town Hall beginning Monday, August 22 between 9 a.m. – 5 p.m. To obtain

your permit, proof of residency is required. Examples include driver's license with a Surfside address, property tax bill, water bill, rental or lease agreement. You must also bring your vehicle registration or copy. There is a limit of three permits per address. There is a \$10 fee per permit and it will expire September 30, 2012. advantage of the low prices from our contractor to trim trees on their property. The work of the Downtown Vision Committee is showing results with cleaner sidewalks, painting of buildings and soon better regulation of news racks and sidewalk tables. The Town Commission has also authorized the renovation of parking lots like recently done at the Post Office throughout downtown and a location sign program is in design. We will also be undergrounding the electric and other utilities in the alleys east and west of Harding as a project cost born by developers. There is also good news on the FY 2011-12 Budget front. The Town Commission set the property millage at 5.5000, a real dollar tax reduction for more than 90 percent of our taxpayers.

Finally, a proposed 342-room hotel on both sides of Collins on the old Beach House property has been reviewed by the Development Impact Committee and the Planning and Zoning Board review was held July 28. Take a look at their website at www.grandbeachhotelsurfside.com. The Town Commission will review the project in September. We have run out of space and there is much more happening. As always, thanks to the Town Commission and the residents of Surfside for the opportunity to manage this wonderful community.

- Opposing any initiative to amend Florida's Constitution to allow casino gambling

Voted to adopt the following ordinances on second reading:

- Repealing Ordinance 2011-1571 "Temporary Moratorium on the Processing of Site Plans, Building Permits, and the Issuance of Certificates of Use or Occupancy for Non-Retail, Non-Restaurant Uses for the properties generally located between 96th and 94th Street and Harding Avenue"
- Creating a section of the Town Code for Permits for Special Events, Enforcement and Coordination with the Police Department
- Amending the Town Code regarding Commercial Standards relating to the appearance of vacant storefronts
- Creating a section of the Town Code regarding Newsracks on public rights-of-way

Town Commission voted/concurred to:

• Using People's Transportation (gas tax) funds, the Town Commission approved the expenditure of \$225,000 as the Town's share of a multi-million dollar State repaving project to install upgraded crosswalks, repair cracked sidewalks, raise manholes and install a bike path which spans the entire length of Collins Avenue in the Town of Surfside.

Collins Avenue Sewer Force Main Construction Project From 96th Street to 72nd Street

The Village of Bal Harbour in conjunction with the Town of Surfside will begin a utility improvement project to construct a new 16" sanitary sewage transmission main along Collins Avenue from 96 Street to 72 Street, to provide a sewage lateral and connection from the Village of Bal Harbour to the City of Miami Beach. Work will be completed by TB Landmark Construction. The project is scheduled to begin in early August, last approximately six months and costs an estimated \$4.2 million.

Work Includes

- Installing the new sewer line in the center of the roadway to enhance the existing line that services Bal Harbour and Surfside
- Interconnecting the system for the Town of Bay Harbor Isles and the Town of Surfside

Please note that weather and/or other unforeseen circumstances could impact this schedule

Traffic Flow and Hours of Operation

In order to perform this work safely there will be lane closures and sidewalk closures at various locations. Entrance to businesses and condominiums will be maintained at all times and pedestrian access will be maintained at all times in areas that do not pose a safety risk.

Work will be done in phases and with the latest technology to minimize time and impacts to the community. Standard hours of operation will take place from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. At times the contractor may need to work 24 hours. Proper notification will be distributed to the community prior to work taking place.

Always Put Safety First

The Village of Bal Harbour and Town of Surfside will make every effort to minimize these effects throughout the construction. For your safety and the safety of others, please use caution and common sense when driving, walking or biking around any construction area. Be advised that this work will not affect your drinking water; safe to drink – safe to flush.

Please note that you might experience the following while construction is under way:

• Partial Road closures — access will be maintained at all times - (SEE REVERSE SIDE)





- Partial Lane closures access will be maintained at all times
- Partial Sidewalk closures pedestrian access will be maintained at all times
- Established detours— maintenance of Traffic signs will be clearly marked
- Increased dust and noise daily restoration of the work area, watering and sweeping
- Increased travel times through the project area
- Heavy machinery, equipment and personnel moving in and around the construction zone

Helpful Tips

- Give yourself a little extra time to reach your destination
- Obey all signs posted within the construction zone
- "NO PARKING" signs will be strictly enforced
- Timely information about upcoming detours and lane closures will be posted weekly on the Village of Bal Harbour/Surfside Project website at www.BalHarbourSurfsideConstruction.com
- Sign up for weekly construction updates via email by contacting the Public Information Officer
- Off-Duty officers will be present while work is in progress




